We have received your application for a permit for harvesting aquatic plants by mechanical means in **9.18** acres in Amnicon Lake, Douglas County.

We found your application to be complete and you are being issued a permit with conditions. Please read your permit carefully and contact us if you have questions.

The permit is being issued with similar conditions as last year and specific conditions which must be followed to comply with harvesting concerns.

Please read your permit carefully and contact us if you have questions. A copy of the permit and all respective attachments must be kept on the harvester at all times during operation. All operators must have read and fully understand the limitations or conditions outlined in this permit before they can operate or harvest any plants by mechanical means. Please insure that all of your operators have read and fully understand the conditions outlined out in this permit before you allow them to do any harvesting.

Attached is a copy of your permit with the conditions that must be followed. In addition, I have included a copy of our findings of fact and conclusion of law and your right to appeal our action.

Permit for Mechanical Removal of Aquatic Plants

The Amnicon-Dowling Lake Management District is hereby granted under Section 23.24, Wisconsin Statutes and Administrative Code NR 109, a permit to conduct mechanical harvesting of aquatic plants in 9.18 acres of Amnicon Lake subject to the following conditions. This permit is issued for a 1 year term and will expire on 12/31/2018.

Permit Conditions

1. You must notify Water Resources Specialist, Mark Sundeen at 715-635-4074, 4 working days prior to anticipated start of the harvesting operation, or provide a schedule of harvesting on request. The Water Resources Management Specialist may schedule and conduct an onsite supervision of harvesting. In the absence of or in conjunction with the Water Resources Management Specialist, DNR Environmental Law Enforcement Staff may schedule and conduct an onsite supervision of harvesting and general permit compliance.
2. WDNR Water Resource Staff, Tribal DNR and GLIFWC will visit Amnicon Lake in early June to assess the proposed navigational harvesting in the area of rice beds and the inlet to determine navigational lane needs and location. Lanes into this area should be kept at a minimum width (10'). Wild rice grows in that area and control of wild rice prohibited. No action authorized in this permit may cause direct removal, or indirect harm to wild rice that can be reasonably predicted or is readily apparent while performing the permitted control action. Causing harm or damage to wild rice will be considered a violation of this permit and other statutes and subject to enforcement action. If at any time this permit may be discovered to affect wild rice, it may be suspended or rescinded to provide a more thorough review of the impacts the permit may have on wild rice.
3. All aquatic plants cut must be removed immediately from the water. Disposal of the harvested aquatic plants must be located in department approved areas and must be in accordance with any applicable county and local regulations.
4. **All mechanical harvesting records must be maintained and made available to the Department upon request. Annual reports summarizing harvesting activities shall be given to the Department by November 1 each year. The annual report shall include a map showing the areas harvested, the total acres harvested hours spent harvesting, number of loads and an estimate of cu. yards or tons of material removed from the water body. The report should also include the dominant plant species and species of interest removed.**
5. All harvesting shall be done in a manner to avoid any possible disturbance of bottom sediments and the organisms living there. **No harvesting in depths less than 3 feet** in order avoid possible disturbance of bottom sediments and protect remaining aquatic plant habitat and the ecology they support. Disturbance of bottom sediments re-suspends sediments which negatively impacts water quality. Cutting plants at or

near the bottom substrate can also stress out and eventually kill more sensitive native species which create openings that would help aggressive exotics such as Eurasian Water Milfoil become established or allow for expansion of existing Curly-Leafed Pondweed densities and distribution. The roots of aquatic plants also stabilize lake sediments and reduce the opportunities for re-suspension which can impact water quality.

Findings of Fact (Facts which were considered in making this decision)

1. The Amnicon-Dowling Lake Management District District filed an application for a permit to conduct a mechanical harvesting operation. The specific areas to be harvested are currently marked on the map attached to this permit.
2. The Department has determined the proposed mechanical harvesting will provide aquatic plant nuisance relief in the designated areas. The mechanical harvesting will provide for increased ease of navigation through designated navigational channels. Some areas may have to be modified in the future to protect critical and sensitive aquatic habitat areas, as they are identified.
3. The total harvesting area is 9.13 acres in size as shown on the attached map.

Conclusion of Law (These are the legal reasons why the Department can make these decisions)

The Department has the authority under the above indicated Statutes and Administrative Codes, to issue a permit for mechanical harvesting of aquatic plants.

Notice of Appeal Rights

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that Wisconsin Statutes and Administrative Codes establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed.

For judicial review of a decision pursuant to ss. 227.52 and 227.53, Wis Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition within the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review shall name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to Section 227.42, Wisconsin Statutes, you have 30 days after the decision is mailed or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review and does not extend the 30-day period for filing a petition for judicial review. The notice is provided pursuant to Section 227.48(2), Wisconsin Statutes.

3. The applicant agrees to inform all operators of harvesting equipment of the conditions and terms of this permit and to insure that all operators understand and abide by those terms and conditions.
4. The applicant agrees to comply with all terms and conditions of this permit, if used, as well as applicable Wisconsin Administrative Rules. The required fee is attached.
5. Conditions related to invasive species movement. The applicant and operator agree to the following methods required under s. NR 109.05(2), Wis. Adm. Code for controlling, transporting and disposing of aquatic plants and animals, and moving water:
 - Aquatic plants and animals shall be removed and water drained from all equipment as required by s. 30.07, Wis. Stats., and ss. NR 19.055 and 40.07, Wis. Adm. Code.
 - Operator shall comply with the most recent Department-approved 'Boat, Gear, and Equipment Decontamination and Disinfection Protocol', Manual Code # 9183.1, available at <http://dnr.wi.gov/topic/invasives/disinfection.html>

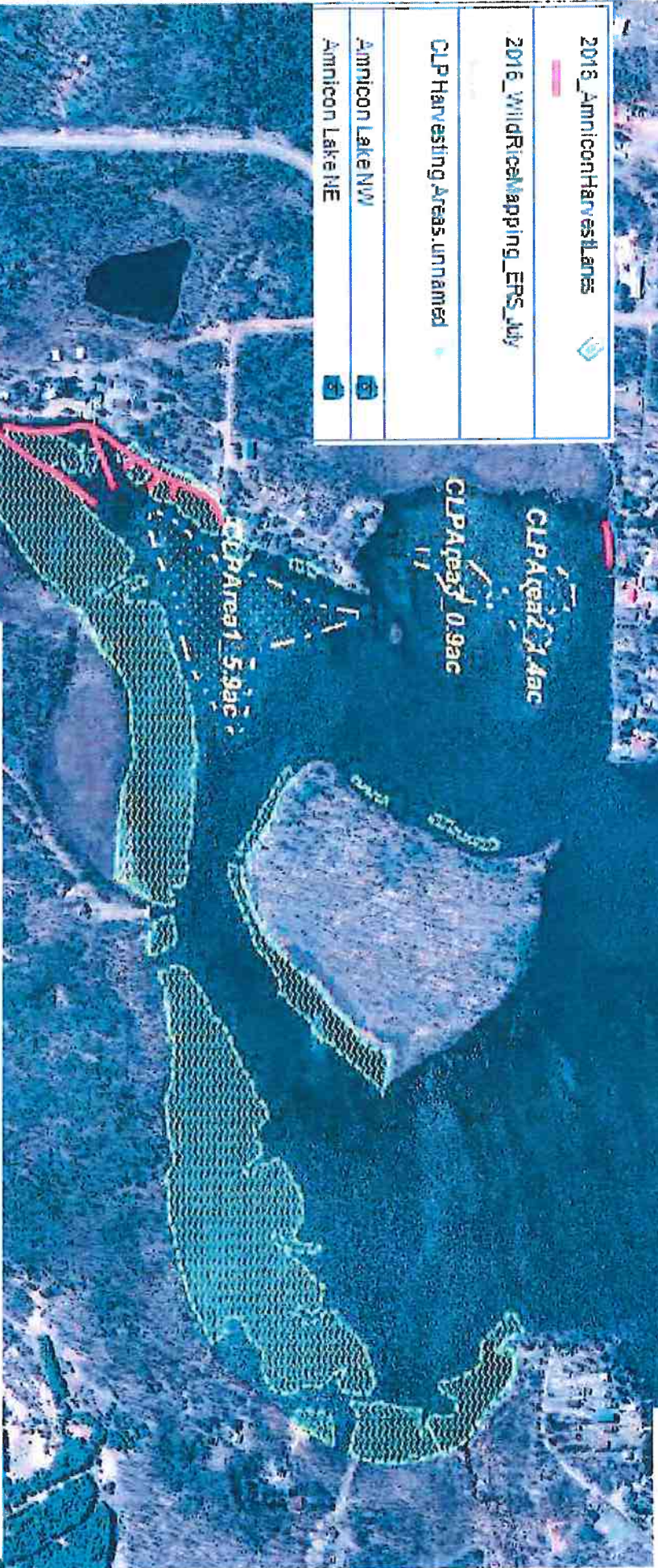
