




SECTION 1 – Residency

Reported on only the property owned or rented the longest, when more than one lake property was in possession.


1. Do you own or rent property on Potato Lake?

3. What type of property do you have on Potato Lake?








Figure 1: Potato Lake

5. On average, how many days per year is your Potato Lake property in use?






SECTION 2 – Septic System Information








3. To the best of your knowledge, is your septic system currently up to date and functioning as intended?






SECTION 3 – Shoreland Stewardship Practices












SECTION 5 – Aquatic Plant Growth




2. Thinking about aquatic plant growth in Potato Lake, would you say there is too little, too much, or about the right amount of aquatic plant growth?



3. At what time period during the year do you consider the aquatic plant growth in Potato Lake to be **excessive**?






SECTION 6 – Aquatic Invasive Species



1. Notate all of the aquatic invasive species that you have heard of.






1. Do you feel that some form of aquatic plant management (excluding algae) is necessary to control vegetation in Potato Lake?


